Goals and Action Points

Composed during the International Youth Freedom Conference on May 2 and 3, 2025 in Middelburg, The Netherlands

### Preamble



We, the 200 youth ambassadors of freedom from more than 50 countries worldwide, gather to commemorate and pass on the liberation 80 years after the end of World War II. We reflect on President Roosevelt's Four Freedoms speech of January 1941.

This document sets out a collection of 192 goals and action points reflecting the principles, needs, and ambitions of the Youth Freedom Conference. These formulations are intended as examples of how fundamental rights and freedoms might be pursued through meaningful and achievable action.

While each goal and action point has been crafted with care, this list is not exhaustive. Other actions, strategies, or policy instruments may be appropriate or necessary depending on context. This treaty does not preclude the recognition or pursuit of additional rights, interpretations, or future developments in law and policy.

#### **Article 1.1: Personal Expression**

### GOAL

#### **Uphold Expression as a Fundamental Right**

**Definition:** To recognize and safeguard freedom of expression as essential for autonomy, dignity, and democratic participation.

#### **Action Points:**

- Educate individuals about the right to free expression and the importance of respectful dialogue.
- Encourage respectful, inclusive public discourse across generations.
- Raise awareness among parents to support children's open development.

## GOAL 02

#### **Ensure Inclusivity of All Forms of Expression**

**Definition:** Guarantee that all modes of expression (oral, written, visual, non-verbal) are respected equally.

#### **Action Points:**

- Establish a review board to adapt freedom of expression definitions to new communication forms.
- Emphasize context and intent in assessing sensitive expression.

# GOAL 03

#### **Foster Pluralism in Expression**

**Definition:** Promote an open society where diverse viewpoints, especially from marginalized groups, are protected and amplified.

- Organize town halls, conventions, and dialogue spaces.
- Create platforms for minority voices and underrepresented perspectives.



## GOAL 04

#### **Safeguard Artistic Expression**

**Definition:** Protect the right of artists to express cultural, political, or personal views through creative media without censorship.

#### **Action Points:**

- Enforce legal protections for artists facing discrimination or censorship.
- Ensure safe creative spaces, particularly in restrictive societies.

# GOAL 05

#### Adapt Legal Frameworks to New Technologies in Art

**Definition:** Update copyright and authorship laws to address challenges from Al-generated and Al-assisted content.

#### **Action Points:**

- Differentiate legally between human-Al collaboration and autonomous Al output.
- Define terms like "Al-generated art" and "derivative works" clearly.
- Require mandatory attribution in Al-assisted creations.

# GOAL 06

#### **Protect Cultural Heritage from Destruction**

**Definition:** Prevent attacks on cultural artworks as acts of protest and reinforce their value in society.

- Enact laws penalizing intentional destruction of cultural heritage.
- Launch public awareness campaigns on the importance of art and history.



GOAL 07

#### **Promote Safe and Free Expression on Digital Platforms**

**Definition:** Enable individuals to express themselves online safely, without manipulation, surveillance, or disinformation.

#### **Action Points:**

- Enforce transparency from platforms on algorithmic changes and takedown requests.
- Ensure AI content moderation is subject to human oversight.

GOAL 08

#### **Build Digital Literacy and Misinformation Resilience**

**Definition:** Equip users with the knowledge and tools to navigate and critically assess digital content.

#### **Action Points:**

- Launch educational programs on media literacy and content verification.
- Raise awareness of fake news and propaganda indicators.
- Set minimum age standards for social media use.

- Train law enforcement in peaceful protest management.
- Recognize symbolic acts (e.g., flag burning) as protected forms of expression.

GOAL 1

#### **Prevent Abuse of Restriction Laws**

**Definition:** Ensure laws restricting expression (e.g., state secrecy, defamation) are clear, proportionate, and not abused.

- Define and review secrecy classifications through independent oversight.
- Protect whistleblowers and journalistic integrity.
- Harmonize hate speech laws internationally while preserving freedom of speech.



#### **Article 1.2: Social media and communication**

### **GOAL 12**

#### **Promote Media Literacy**

**Definition:** Ensure that all individuals can critically assess and understand media content to make informed decisions.

#### **Action Points:**

- Integrate critical thinking and media literacy into education systems.
- Promote the humanities and diverse journalistic perspectives.
- Provide training on identifying different types of media and their purposes.

**Definition:** Eliminate financial, geographic, and social barriers to accessing quality information.

#### **Action Points:**

- Expand affordable internet access and infrastructure.
- Reduce paywalls through institutional partnerships and subsidies.

# GOAL **14**

#### **Provide Contextual Integrity in News Consumption**

**Definition:** Empower individuals to understand the full context behind information and news they receive.

- Use ethical Al to summarize and present news from multiple angles.
- Ensure transparency in news agency funding and operations.
- Encourage multi-perspective communication from governments.



### GOAL 15

#### **Strengthen Data Protection Laws**

**Definition:** Protect user privacy and personal data across all digital platforms.

#### **Action Points:**

- Enforce the right to delete data and auto-delete inactive accounts.
- Notify users when their data is stored, shared, or sold.
- Implement standard privacy protocols across platforms.

#### GOAL 16

#### **Increase Transparency of Data Usage**

**Definition:** Ensure users are clearly informed about how their data is used.

#### **Action Points:**

- Require tech companies to publish plain-language summaries of data policies.
- Make government rules and responsibilities on data visible to the public.
- Hold platforms accountable for breaches and misuse.

#### **Prevent Government and Corporate Censorship**

**Definition:** Protect freedom of expression from manipulation by state or commercial interests.

#### **Action Points:**

- Establish an international expert body to monitor and report censorship by states and corporations.
- Promote global standards on transparency, pluralism, and expression.
- Enforce reputational sanctions (e.g., blacklists, certifications).
- Regulate lobbying in media and ensure diverse ownership.

## GOAL 59

### **Safeguard Independent Media and Democratic Participation**

**Definition:** Ensure journalists and citizens can express themselves without fear or bias.

#### **Action Points:**

- Pass strong protections for investigative journalists and whistleblowers.
